Trinity College Foundation Studies (TCFS) is one of the first educational institutions in Australia to trial the use of iPads in the classroom, having launched its '**Step Forward**' program on 23 August.

Under this pilot program, each of the 50 students in the August intake has been issued with an iPad and TCFS lecturers are actively using the new technology to enhance their students' academic experience.

The trial, which is already showing encouraging results, has drawn praise from visiting international expert in education technology, [Dr Gary Stager](#). It's also proving a hit with students!

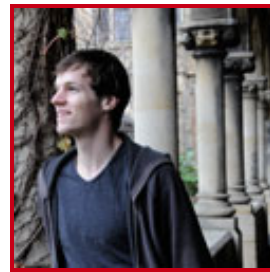

With the first cohort of Melbourne Model students commencing Masters-level degrees next year, Trinity has established some 15 named scholarships for outstanding graduate students, each covering up to half the annual College fees. This provides 50 weeks in residence, with all the benefits of College life, for about \$10,000 pa. Engineering, Law, Medicine, Dentistry, Education and general scholarships. Applications now open.

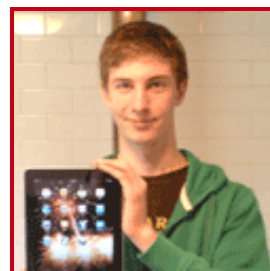
### [Trinity Triptych opportunity](#)

### [Open Day iPad winner](#)

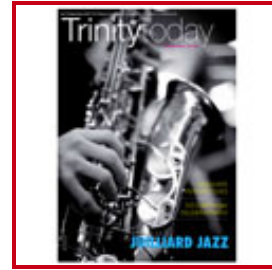

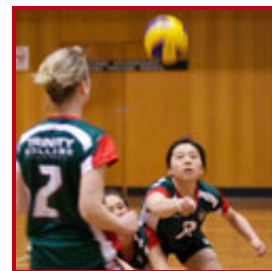
### [Easing the hunger](#)

### [To Harvard \(via Paris and Rwanda\)](#)

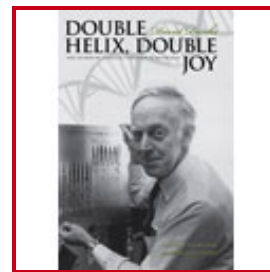

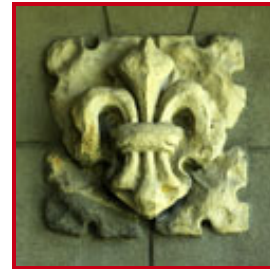

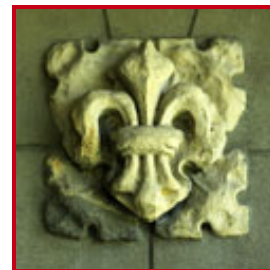
