The cover story for the Summer 2010 edition of Apple University Consortium's magazine *Wheels for the Mind* reports on the success of Trinity's trial use of iPads in Foundation Studies classrooms. In it, TCFS Associate Dean (Academic Operations) **Glen Jennings** says this technology 'opens up creativity' allowing students to move on to more advanced, complex, interesting, exciting and fun things. 'That's the kind of dynamic process where we want education to be,' he says.



Lead' profiles Trinity

Trinity's Indigenous perspectives are also being given a national profile by Dare to Lead, a Commonwealth funded project that focuses on improving educational outcomes for Indigenous students. Established in 2000, over 53% of all Australian schools (more than 5,500) are currently members of this coalition.

Summer building works

Work has already started on refurbishing residential facilities in the Memorial Building – more commonly known as **Jeopardy** – under the next stage of the College's Building Master Plan. The **Behan car park** is also being redeveloped and will be closed until 14 February 2011. This work includes redirecting storm water pits, currently draining into Royal Parade, back into the College's underground tanks and may involve some temporary closures to access via the main gate. The College apologises for any inconvenience this may cause.



Awards for Advancement

Trinity's Director of Advancement **Dr Alan Watkinson**, has received the 2010 Peter Crook Award, given by the Victoria/Tasmania Branch of the Association of Development and Alumni Professionals in Education (ADAPE) for outstanding service to development. In September, Alan was also joint recipient of the national Trevor Wigney Award, making Trinity the only institution in Australia to have had two Trevor Wigney winners on staff. The other was Clare Pullar in 2006.



Hair raising success

Several Trinity teams were among Australia's 129,719 Movember participants who raised a total of \$19,170,836 to support men's health. The resident students' team, the Jesters, raised \$1,715, the Information Technology department's MOFear team raised \$1,035, and Director of Finance and Administration, Mr Gary Norman, raised an impressive \$650 on his own.
